

## **CELEBRATING SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY**

### **TULSA COUNTY MEDICAL SOCIETY FOUNDATION (Formerly TCMS CDF)**

In 2002, with the help of a generous grant from the Hudson Foundation and contributions from many others, the Foundation constructed a building housing the new headquarters of TCMS at 5315 South Lewis. Again in 2006, the Hudson Foundation issued another challenge grant. The TCMS membership responded generously to these challenge grants and to other fundraising efforts to retire the mortgage. The building has a value of 1.2 million dollars and the remaining mortgage was less than \$64,000.00. The mortgage was retired December, 2007 in celebration of the 100th anniversary of TCMS. With no mortgage, the Foundation has an increased amount of funds to distribute to local under-funded community health related needs.

The mission of the Foundation is to respond to Tulsa's medical community service needs. Over the years, through the generous support of TCMS members, we have been able to support numerous local agencies and projects like the Parent Child Center, Day Center for the Homeless, Domestic Violence Intervention Services, Family Safety Center, Hospice of Green Country, Northeast Oklahoma Tobacco Coalition, Retired Nurses Volunteer organization, The Center for Individuals with Physical Challenges and AIDS education, to name but a few.

The Foundation supported legislation to create a new medical license for retired physician volunteers in area clinics for the indigent. The Foundation supports malpractice insurance premiums for these retired volunteers. Seminars have been held to educate physicians on how to volunteer their time in the clinics, which has increased the number of physicians volunteering, resulting in more patients being seen. This support of local clinics for the indigent is contributing in a significant way to lessening the patient load in local emergency rooms. Non-profit groups in Tulsa have had the unique opportunity to have a meeting room available to them at no cost. Members of Tulsa County Medical Society, specialty societies and other health related organizations have found the meeting rooms very valuable to them for both business and personal use.

The TCMS Foundation Scholarship program was established in 1965. Since the program began over \$1 million in scholarships has been provided to medical students.

Project TCMS, Tulsa Charitable Medical Services, was implemented in 2011 to coordinate elective specialty care for uninsured low income residents of Tulsa County. Project TCMS is a collaboration of the medical community with the referrals to the program coming from area safety net primary care clinics. Project TCMS is a great example of physician leadership and missionary work in our own community.
